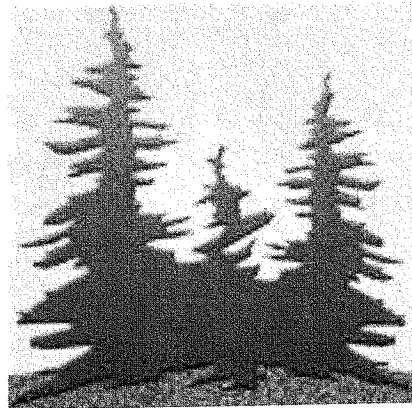


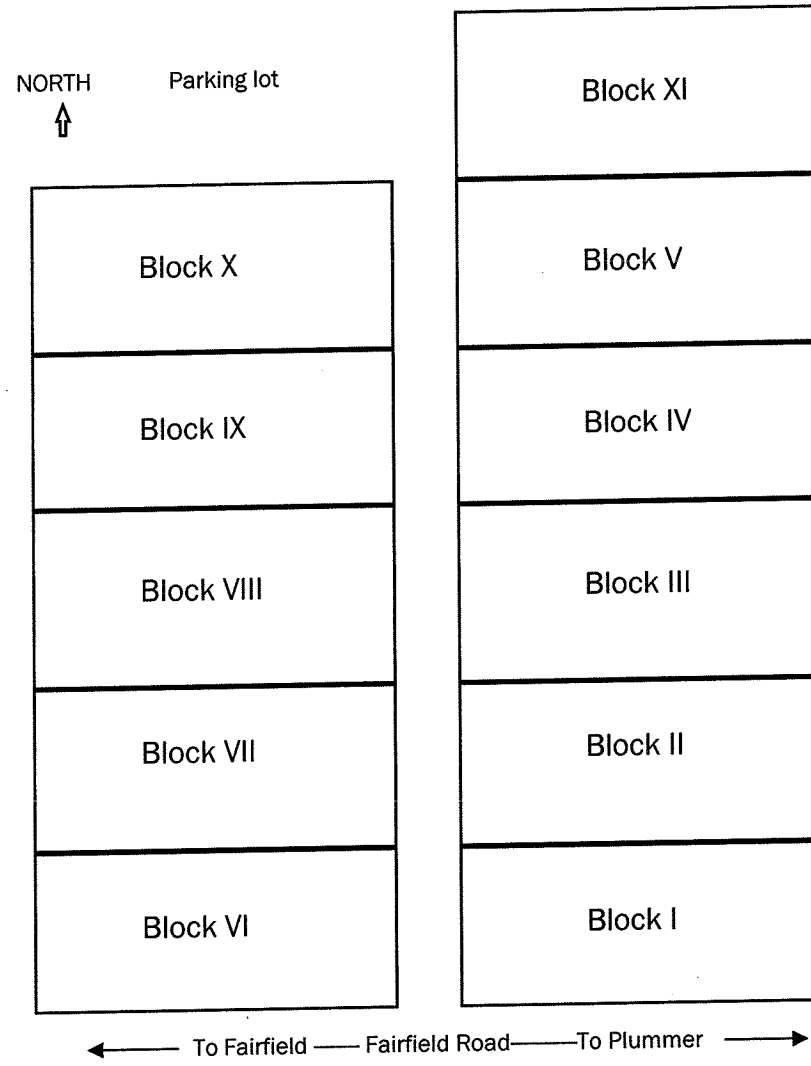

# Cemetery Regulations

## Purchasing Lots

Cemetery lots, or burial spaces, are not purchased for ownership like other property. What is actually purchased is the right to use a space for the burial of human dead.

Burial plots are five feet (5') by nine feet (9') in size.

Procurement is made through City Hall and upon payment in full, purchasers receive a Certificate of the Right for Burial.

## Installment

### Purchases

Burial spaces can be purchased on an installment basis over a twelve month period if desired. Ten percent of the purchase price is required for down payment and the City does not charge interest on the remaining balance.

## Transfers

Transfer of a Certificate of the Right for Burial allowed with the

consent of the City. A new Certificate will then be issued in the recipient's name.

Transfers can be made through the act of sale or gift, through a Last Will and Testament, or by the Laws of Intestacy.

## Buy Back

The City may buy back certificates of ownership at half of the current purchase price for unused burial spaces provided there are sufficient funds budgeted.

## Internment

The City requests a minimum of 48 hours notice before internment and will try to conduct internments on the day and at the time requested by the family. There is no additional charges for weekend or holiday services.

The City will accommodate graveside services, and an alternative site is available when weather conditions do not permit a graveside service.

Only one internment of a casket shall be made in a single grave site. The addition of one cremains (ashes) in a grave with a casket is permissible. Two cremains may be interred in one grave. Other arrangements may be granted by the City.



*The City reserves a perpetual right to enter and to leave any burial space for passage to and from other spaces.*

All graves must be opened and closed by the City, unless special permission is granted by the City. Burial vaults are required. All internments

are subject to applicable charges, to be paid in advance.

## Monuments and Markers

The location of all monuments or markers must be approved by the City and shall not encroach upon the alleys, streets, walkways, or adjoining grave sites.

Monuments must be placed on a foundation sufficient to support them. The number of monuments, stones, or markers is limited to two per grave site. Special permission may be granted for one additional stone.



*Memorial stones or plaques, memorializing someone that is not actually interred in the lot, may be added to a grave space.*

## Enclosures and Coverings

No enclosures, such as fences, copings, or hedges are allowed without prior City approval. Also, no bricks, rocks or other materials are allowed to cover any lots without prior City approval. Grave mounds are not permitted. The graves shall receive the same general care as other parts of the lawn.

## Plantings and Other Items

No trees, shrubs, or plants shall be planted, pruned, or removed without consent of the City. Pot hangers should be placed next to the collar of the headstone. Flowers and other items left on a grave shall not interfere with the maintenance of the cemetery.

Dead flowers, broken vases, and other items in a broken or deteriorated state may be removed by the City.

## Rates

Rates for purchase of Certificates of the Right for Burial in a grave site and rates for internment are set by the City Council. These rates may change from time to time as the cost of maintaining the cemetery and providing services change.

## Full Ordinance

The current rates are:

Purchase price (per grave site)  
\$300.00

Internment of casket \$400.00

Internment of cremains \$150.00
