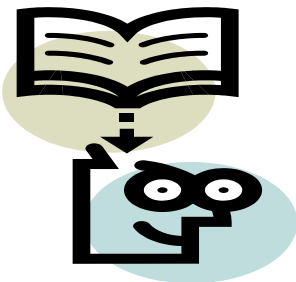

Did you know these fun facts about water:

- Taking a bath requires up to 70 gallons of water. A five-minute shower uses only 10 to 25 gallons.
- A running toilet can waste up to 200 gallons of water per day.
- At 1 drip per second, a faucet can leak 3,000 gallons per year.
- An individual uses about 50 gallons of water every day.

SAVE 10

Here are several ways that you can save 10 gallons of water.

- Turn off the tap while brushing your teeth. 2 times = 10 gallons
- Turn off the tap while shaving. Once = 10 gallons
- Shorten your shower. 2 minutes = 10 gallons
- Place a water-filled gallon jug in the toilet tank. 10 flushes = 10 gallons
- Don't let your faucet run. 4 minutes = 10 gallons
- Don't let the hose run while washing your car. 1 minute = 10 gallons

GARBAGE PICKUP

All garbage cans need to be along the edge of the road or alley for pick up. Cans not placed at curbside for pick up will be passed by and not dumped. Also as a reminder if you are setting out more cans than you are scheduled for, your account will be changed to reflect the number of cans being set out.
