## Message from the Mayor

Some of the things we've accomplished over the last 4 years:

- Replaced the roof and windows at the Community Center.
- Repaired the interior ceilings at the Community Center.
- Purchased and installed new playground equipment at the Community Center.
- New tennis nets for the Community Center tennis court.
- Constructed picnic gazebo at Community Center Park.
- Paved 1st Street to P Street.
- Paved P Street to Highway 95.
- Paved 8th Street from P to Milwaukee.
- Paved A Street to Fairfield Road.
- Paved E Street from 11th to 15th in front of the school.
- Paved 11th Street from A to B streets.
- Paved 12th Street from A to B streets.
- Paved Pole Yard Road with regrinds.
- Installed sidewalk on 11th from E to Alley between B & C Streets to augment existing sidewalk installed by the tribe for school children going to Wellness Center.
- Purchased and installed crosswalk lights on highway 95.
- Installed new water main from Highway 5 to B Street on 9th Street.
- Installed 20 new water lines
- Replaced 37 Water meters
- Installed pressure valve on Plummer Ave so SE corner of town finally has decent water pressure.
- Rebuilt Electrical infrastructure, project slated to be complete by end January at the latest.
- Replaced Electric meters.
- Upgrading sewer plant.
- Replaced manholes to control Inflow and infiltration.
- Located inflow and infiltration leaks to stem sewer violation problems.
- Replaced sewer main on 11th Street.
- Worked with tribe to construct sewer catch basin to help with our sewer overflows.
- Lifted sewer & water moratoriums which added addition sewer connections.
- Working with the tribe to start developing Pole Yard property for business and light industry.
- Working with USDA and Idaho Department of Commerce to provide a dedicated Senior Center in Plummer.
- Set law to allow Tiny Homes as primary and secondary residences in city limits.
- Opened Plummer back up for development.
- Replaced Sewer Mains on C and D Streets
- Replaced Street Lights
- Replaced City Street signs
- The removal of Stateline grain elevators that saved the city over a million dollars on the electric rebuild project.
- The new Coopers which have made the outage response time less for outages, on not waiting for Avista to come.
- The new agreement for frontier which gave the City a added revenue
- Upsizes the 4 inch sewer main and added Manholes to access the line from 5th Toetly Road.
- The collaboration with the Park to due pass needed tree trimming and clean up.
