Reminder from City Chief of Police Brad Hampton:

Vicious Dogs

Under Idaho Code 25-2810 you can be cited for keeping Dangerous and At-risk dogs. This is a misdemeanor charge which can carry up to a year in county jail along with fines. In addition, if your dog bites someone you can be held responsible for the cost of that person's medical treatment. The city also has an ordinance concerning vicious dogs. This ordinance can be viewed on the City of Plummer website.

3-1-6: Vicious Dogs

- A. Keeping and Containing: Any person being the owner or keeper of any vicious dog who shall permit the same to run at large within the limits of the city shall be liable for a civil penalty, as may be set by the district or tribal court and in compliance with section 1-4-1 of this code, together with the cost of enforcement, and shall be compelled to obtain a license on said dog for the current year.
- B. Impounding and/or slaying of a vicious dogs: Any dog found running at large contrary to the provisions of this chapter may be apprehended by any designated tribal, BIA, or city official and shall be impounded or delivered to its owner if such owner is known; provided, however that if any dangerous or vicious dog so found at large cannot be safely taken up and impounded, such a dog may be slain forthwith (ORD. 296,10-22-1991; amd. 1993 Code).
