As you know, school will be starting soon and I wanted to remind everyone that E Street is closed to through traffic during school hours (7 a.m.– 3:30 p.m.) If you see the gates closed, do not enter or you could receive a citation for I.C. 49-801; Failure to Obey Traffic Control Device. Also, speed limits are reduced on D and E Streets to 15 mph during school hours. The fine for speeding in a school zone is \$156.50. Please keep in mind these rules and restrictions are there to protect the kids.

Hello Residents of Plummer. I hope you are all doing well and you are enjoying your summer.

The City of Plummer is working on our water line inventory which is required by the Environmental Protection Agency. This inventory is for City of Plummer residents only and is to determine if residents have lead or copper pipes for drinking water. We have a very simple survey for city residents to fill out. You can find this survey on the City of Plummer web site and it is also available at City Hall. Your assistance in completing this survey is very much appreciated. We will be beginning paving work at the end of September and into October. We will have exact dates and schedules for you when dates and times are confirmed with our paving contractor. The streets that will be paved this year is all of 9th, 8th, Pine, and G street. We will also be paving a portion of E street and B street. You may be asking, why is your street not getting paved? There are multiple reasons for us paving these roads. First of all, our grant funding has determined a certain portion of these roads must be paved specifically. We also have some water and sewer work that needs done in certain areas of town and we do not want to pave and then have to tear up new roads. Our goal is to have the entire City of Plummer paved in the next three years. This is, of course, dependent on funding but we are working hard to pursue grants and funding that improve our infrastructure. We are excited for these much-needed improvements and hope you are as well.

Last month we approved our fiscal year 2025 budget and we are looking forward to continuing to serve you in the new year. We just hired a new Lineman and would like to welcome Jesse Carroll to our team. We are looking to be able to serve you better. We are also still working on zoning and ordinance changes and will have more details as we have them. We just wrapped up our 2nd Vision to Action workshop for the City of Plummer pole yard. I would like to thank everyone who came to the workshops and provided input. We are now taking your ideas and searching for grants that can turn these ideas into reality. We are working with the Coeur d' Alene Tribe, The Center for Creative Land Recycling, DEQ, and the EPA and together we look to make the pole yard a place that everyone here in Plummer can enjoy. We will keep you updated on this as we are in the beginning stages of this process. I hope this letter finds you well. Take care of each other and please enjoy the rest of your summer.
