ICRMP Insurance Policy Renewal: DISCUSSION

The City Clerk presented the Council with the Policy Renewal from ICRMP Insurance. The city's premiums will be going up significantly due to the spike in the insurance industry that ICRMP is not able to absorb the cost.

Staff Reports:

Cory Long- Electric Lineman: Was going over the street light accounts that are not being charged. He also had been looking into other electric companies that charge rent to vendors that use the poles for their lines and found the city is charging 50-75% less than the other companies to rent the poles.

Rick Wren- Public Works Director: Updated the Council about the paving project that is beginning this month. The city will put out bids to contractors twice in the paper two weeks apart and the bids will be sent to City Hall.

The city will need to inform the Residents about lead & copper testing that will begin before October 1,2024 to find the locations that need their pipes replaced to be up to code with the federal guidelines. The city will put this information out in the City Newsletter and sent with their utility bills.
